Also reminded to catch coughs and sneezes in tissues – Follow Catch it, Bin it, Kill it and to avoid touching face, eyes, nose or mouth with hands. To help reduce the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19) reminding everyone of the public health advice - Posters, leaflets and other materials are available for display. Hand sanitising stations to be set up on all entrances/exits and for front and back of house staff areas Written instructions on what to be cleaned and how frequently to be displayed and recorded. Rigorous checks will be carried out by managers to ensure that the necessary procedures are being followed. 	Food handlers are not required to wear face coverings although visors will be supplied if wanted. However, food handlers MUST NOT touch their faces and must wash their hands immediately if they do.	
	Staff to be reminded that wearing of gloves is	

not a substitute for good hand washing.
